

Join the Radiological Emergency Volunteer Corps **REVC**



What is the REVC?

- **Trained volunteers** who are prepared to respond to radiological emergencies in North Carolina.
- Our members have backgrounds in **radiation science, public health, and healthcare.**
- In the event of a radiological emergency, **we assist with monitoring** the public and emergency workers for radiological contamination.

Why the REVC?

- Over 88 percent of North Carolinians live within 50 miles of a nuclear power plant, according to the 2010 U.S. Census.
- Radiological equipment is in use at industrial and medical facilities across the state every day.
- If a radiological emergency occurred at a facility, thousands of people may require monitoring.
- Emergency management agencies may be overwhelmed – **we need volunteers ready to help!**

As an active REVC volunteer, what would I do?

- **Maintain a current profile** in the state emergency volunteer registry system, ServNC.
- **Participate in drills and exercises** to test the ability of emergency management agencies to respond to radiological emergencies.
- In the event of a radiological emergency, **set-up and/or operate population monitoring points** at Community Reception Centers to prevent any radiological contamination from spreading further.

What are the requirements to be a member of the REVC?

Volunteers receive FREE training that may also provide continuing education (CE) credits. Training includes the following:

- Basic Incident Command System (100/200/700/800)
- Health Physics Basics
- General Radiological Emergency Preparedness (REP) Overview
- Prepare For Reception Center Operations (PPE/dosimetry)
- Reception Center Operations (Population Monitoring)
- Reception Center Set-Up & Staffing Practical (with jurisdictions)
